began to appear non-stop. "My hands are still shaking," he said two days later. "I'm convinced this may only happen once in a lifetime . . . I hope not!"

Toddy I. of Bonnybridge, Sterlingshire in the UK—a longtime user of several brands of pulse induction detectors was eager to try out the new Garrett *ATX* in England. He reports that the "*ATX* is very good at finding small silver on mineralised farmland." His best coin finds so far are: a broken silver Roman denarius of Domitian (80 AD), a full denarius of Vespasian (69–79 AD, seen on his *ATX*), and a King Edward silver penny (ca. 1272–1307 AD).

Toddy's most recent *ATX* find is a very rare King David I of Scotland penny (ca. 1136 AD). This tiny silver coin was the first minted in Scotland (seen by pen tip for scale).

Caches, Hoards and Coin Spills



Finder: Curtis M., Lexington, MA Using: *AT Pro*

Find: The top of an old coin purse, with eight Mercury dimes, a Barber dime and a Standing Liberty quarter.



Finder: David P., Big Spring, TX Using: *GTA 1000, Master Hunter CXII* Find: David and his wife found this spill of coins in the back yard of their home, which was built in 1947. The 27 coins are all dated prior to 1947, and include: four Buffalo nickels, 13 Wheat pennies, an Indian Head penny, a 1945 Walking Liberty half dollar, a Standing Liberty quarter, and seven Mercury dimes.



Finder: Rodney W., Camanche, IA Using: *ACE 350*

Find: Rodney found a modern cache while hunting in a park near his home. His *ACE 350* gave him a belltone signal next to a chain link fence. He continued digging and using his *Pro-Pointer* until he recovered 94 total coins. "Sad to say that after a good cleaning, there were no silver coins nor wheat backs," he said. "All were dated from 1965 to 1983." It was still an exciting find for Rodney, who has used Garrett detectors since the 1970s.

Lowside Quarter Hoard

Finders: Daniel B. and Justin B., UK Using: *ACE 250, EuroACE*

Finds: Justin received a Garrett *EuroACE* in February for his birthday and soon became friends with Daniel, who got an *ACE 250* in March. The two have since become regular hunting partners, and this past summer they made a spectacular discovery of a hoard of Roman silver coins.

They each found one silver coin the first evening in July, but returned the next day to dig another 19 Roman coins all from an area of about ten square meters. Their local FLO and the landowner have

"I decided to recheck the hole," he said. "Another signal! I see silver again! Out rolls an 1892 Barber dime." Checking the hole for a third time, Brandon pulled an 1887 Indian Head penny. "Three coins in the same hole!" he said. "All firsts for me! Needless to say, I am hooked on metal detecting."

International Coin Discoveries

Coin Hunting is Productive in Japan

Find: Shigeki lives about 400 miles west from Tokyo and he reports that metal detecting has not yet become a popular sport in his area. "Most areas are untouched and many coins are not buried deep in the ground," he said. When he purchased his *ACE 250* in 2013, he went to a nearby Buddhist temple park that has been in use for about 500 years.

"I found four old coins made from 1688 to 1922 within 30 minutes of searching, and that was my first metal detecting," said Shigeki. "Most people here in Japan have never seen metal detectors. When I was detecting, some old lady was staring at me, and asked me, 'Are you examining the radiation level around this area?'

"It's so fun detecting here . . . if you don't mind people staring at you every time you use metal detectors!"





Metal Detectors and Archaeology



Last December, members of the Spanish Association for the Metal-Detection Defense, together with ORCROM METALLDETECTORS' specialists, were invited to participate in archaeological work located in the necropolis of Cerro de las Cabezas in Castilla-La Mancha in order to detect archaeological features on the site where last August were found fourteen cremation tombs, a barrow and a funeral pyre of the necropolis.

During the exploration, led by a team of archaeologists and experts promoted by ANTHROPOS SL and under the direction of Luis Benitez de Lugo, it was possible to locate over 400 objects of great historical value. These were at risk because of the floods of the nearby Jabalón river and also agricultural tasks held regularly in the area. The use of metal detectors and especially the new *ATX* Garrett detector with pulse technology allowed an exhaustive analysis of the land and therefore many objects of great archaeological value such as brooches, coins, weapons, projectiles and various ornaments (many of them belonging to the Iberian period) were located.

This was the first archaeological exploration with metal detectors in Castilla-La Mancha, opening a new horizon of cooperation that can be helpful for future archaeological studies. The intervention was previously authorized by the local institution.

All materials are being studied and inventoried by a team of expert archaeologists, who once complete with the analysis, will submit a report to the Ministry of Culture of the area.






