"It paid off! I dug all the penny signals and found a nice chunky silver bracelet half, and by not giving up on the pull tabs—even after digging 20 or 30—I was pleasantly surprised to see gold in the hole!!.

"It is this nice Dos Peso pendant. I am so excited! This is what I have been missing by giving up on pull tabs and pennies. Lesson learned. DIG 'EM! Thanks to the YouTuber and to Garrett for the *AT Pro*. I always recommend this detector to others."

## FOUND FROM WHERE?

Nearly 50 years after a woman lost her boyfriend's class ring in a Maine department store, it turned up buried six inches deep in the floor of a forest in Finland. "I was shocked. And didn't really believe that it was his. I needed to see it," Debra M., the owner of the ring told CNN of the surprise discovery. The man who found it was just as excited.

The ring's journey began in Portland, Maine, in 1973. It belonged to her high school boyfriend, Shawn (whom she later married in 1977, he passed away in 2017 after battling cancer for 6 years), and he gave it to her before he left Morse High School for college. She lost it not long after he left, when she removed it to wash her hands at a department store in Portland. "It wasn't there when I went back and it was only minutes and that was the last I saw of it."

The ring was found in a forest in Finland by Marko S., a 38-year-old sheet-metal worker who spends a few hours a week looking for historic items with his Garret *ACE 250* metal detector. Marko posted a photo of the ring to the Morse High School Class of 1973 Facebook page and quickly received a response. The alumni group had no trouble finding the original owner. Debra was glad the ring found its way home. She believes the discovery was a message from her late husband that he's still with her.

#### **Garrett's Code of Detecting Ethics**

Charles Garrett always urged his fellow searchers to conduct themselves as responsible treasure hunters and to leave their hunt areas in better condition than they found them. Please follow your local directives during the current health crisis, but when you are able to safely enjoy detecting, here are just a few of his keys to good conduct in the field:



- Never trespass or hunt on private property without permission.
- National and state parks/monuments, etc. are absolutely off-limits.
- Always fill in every hole that you dig.
- Do not leave litter or other discarded junk items lying around.
- Always carry out all rubbish and dug targets with you when you leave a search area.
- Use reasonable caution in digging toward any target, particularly in areas where you are uncertain of the ground conditions.
- Keep informed on and obey all local and national legislation relating to the discovery and reporting of found treasures.
