KOREAN BEACH FIND

Finder: Michael P., South Korea

Find: Michael works and lives with his family in South Korea. They often go search a beach that is about an hour from their home. While searching alone on a Memorial Day weekend, he discovered a true piece of Korean history.

Michael shares, "After finding a few modern coins, I got a fat, screaming '57' on the *AT Max*; which is odd considering no modern coins in Korea come up at 57. My first thought was that it was maybe a modern 500 won coin that was coming up at 57 due to being in the salt water for so long. Thus, at first I was not excited nor anxious to get down there and get it.

'I dug out the hole, singing a sweet song to the coin as I looked for it, and pulled it out. When I pulled the coin out, it was green, as usual, and round like a 500 won coin, but it still had a nice cap of a sand to be rubbed off to see what it actually was. Still singing to the

coin, I popped the sand off with my left thumb while filming with my right hand. That was when I saw the square hole in the middle of the coin! I finally did it! I found my first whole (non-broken) Joseon Dynasty cash coin! I nearly passed out, but I cleaned it off to take a look at the mint character on the back and it indicated this one was from approximately 1757.

I quickly thought, 'Maybe there are more,' and I looked at the way the water pulls away from the spot where I found the coin. I started detecting in that direction hoping that maybe a heavier (larger) coin might have been dropped off first by the waves. After about five minutes of digging up a few fishing weights and modern coins, "BAM!", a '57', again! This 57 was about 12 feet from the first find, but in the exact direction that the water pulls out during low tide. It was perfect. I started to dig and BOOM, I immediately saw the squared hole on this one.

'But this time, something was different. As expected, this one was the bigger, slightly heavier cash coin; worth two of the other coin during the Joseon Dynasty. After some serious cleaning work, I used the characters on the reverse to find out this coin was minted around 1752. These were the first two whole Joseon Dynasty





coins that I have ever found and I don't think I would have found them with anything but the *AT Max*."

Garrett's Code of Detecting Ethics

Charles Garrett always urged his fellow searchers to conduct themselves as responsible treasure hunters and to leave their hunt areas in better condition than they found them. Please follow your local directives during the current health crisis, but when you are able to safely enjoy detecting, here are just a few of his keys to good conduct in the field:



- Never trespass or hunt on private property without permission.
- National and state parks/monuments, etc. are absolutely off-limits.
- Always fill in every hole that you dig.
- Do not leave litter or other discarded junk items lying around.
- Always carry out all rubbish and dug targets with you when you leave a search area.
- Use reasonable caution in digging toward any target, particularly in areas where you are uncertain of the ground conditions.
- Keep informed on and obey all local and national legislation relating to the discovery and reporting of found treasures.
